Key Areas of Learning

As Historians we will be learning about the events of 1939-45, including how and why the Second World War started and the experience of children who were evacuated. We will learn about the lives of key figures during the war, including Winston Churchill and Adolf Hitler, rationing, the role of women in the war effort and the holocaust.

As Scientists we will be learning about the human body and how it changes and develops during a human's life time. We look at the stages of human development from reproduction and pre-natal life through to old age and death. We will also study how babies grow in terms of height and weight, puberty, changes in old age and life expectancy.

As Design Technicians we will use 3D modelling programs to create Anderson Shelters on computers.

As Artists we will use colour mixing to create vivid panoramas based on the Blitz.

ENGLISH

Through studying the texts '**Good Night Mr Tom**' and '**Rose Blanche**' (both based during World War 2), the children will write diary extracts and narratives that include fronted adverbial phrases, correctly punctuated direct speech and a growing range of ambitious vocabulary. We will also focus on securing consistently accurate basic sentence structure and punctuation and developing our continuous cursive style of handwriting.

MATHS

The children will study:

Number and place value, including how to partition and represent numbers in a broad range of different ways.

Written and mental methods for **addition, subtraction, multiplication and division**.

Statistics (including tables and graphs).

Calculating **area**.

RE

Believing and behaving: Belief into action in **Sikhism**.

Christianity: The story of Christmas and why it's important to Christians.

JIGSAW (PSHE)

Being Me in My World: My year ahead; Being me in Britain; Responsibilities, rewards and consequences. **Celebrating differences**: Different cultures, racism, bullying.

PE

Continued focus on the ABCs (Agility, Balance and Co-ordination) through **Gymnastics** (indoor PE) and **outdoor and adventurous activities** (outdoor PE and residential)
