Year 2:



ZEUS



POSEIDON




Hades (right) is the Olympian god of the Underworld and the dead. The most famous story about Hades is where he kidnapped Persephone. She became his wife. They had no children. His Roman name is Pluto. He wears a helmet that radiates darkness.
